What is HIPAA?

The Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA) is a federal law that protects sensitive Patient Health Information (PHI) from being disclosed without the patient's consent or knowledge.

What is FERPA?

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA) is a federal law that protects the privacy of student education records.
